

Croatian Beekeepers Federation(CBF) was founded on 12th of December in 1954. Back then, there were 12 cooperative associations and four beekeeping associations with approximately 116.000 beehives. One of the founders and the first president was the academician Ivo Tomašec. Current president is Vladimir Bilek.

Aim:

- development of beekeeping
- promotion of beekeeping
- increase the number of members
- education...

Present:

- 150 cooperative associations with more than 7.000 members
- more than 11.000 beekeepers in Register of beekeepers and apiaries
- more than 550.000 beehives
- production of 7.000 8.000 tons per year
- more than 20 types of honey





Specificity:


- Everything is digitized

Croatian border with roads








County of Istria with marked apiaries




